**DRAFT ORDER**

**After having read the papers filed of record and after hearing counsel for  
the Applicant, the following order is made:**

1. The Respondent is placed under provisional liquidation in the hands of the  
Master of the High Court;

2. A rule *nisi* is issued calling upon the Respondent or any other interested party to appear before the above Honourable Court on **TUESDAY 14 APRIL 2020** at **10H00** and give reasons, if any, why the following order should not be granted:

2.1. That the Respondent be placed under final liquidation; and

2.2. That the attorney and own costs of this application be costs in the liquidation.

3. Service of this Order shall be effected as follows:

3.1. By sheriff at the registered office of the Respondent;

3.2. By sheriff on the Respondent's employees (if any) by affixing a copy thereof to any notice board to which the employees have access inside the premises or by affixing a copy thereof to the front door of the premises from which the Respondent conducts business and on any trade unions which the Respondent's employees are member of, if any.

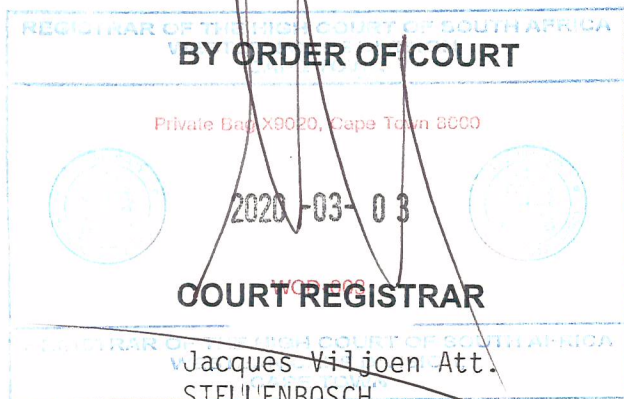
3.3. By sheriff on the South African Receiver of Revenue;

3.4. By one publication in each of the Cape Times and Die Burger newspapers of paragraphs 1 and 2 hereof.

4. The Registrar shall transmit a copy of the winding-up order to the Sheriff of the province in which the registered office of the Respondent is situate

and the Sheriff of every province in which it appears that the Respondent owns a business.

5. The Sheriff shall attach all property which appears to belong to the Respondent and transmit to the Master an inventory of all property attached by him or her in terms of section 19 of the Insolvency Act 24 of 1936.
